Gold Beach mother drowns

Community effort underway to collect donations for husband, children

A Gold Beach woman drowned in the Rogue River Monday after-noon, leaving behind

her husband and two her husband and two young children, ac-cording the Curry County Sheriff's De-partment. Cherie Michelle

Jarnigan, 38, was spending the day at the east end of Hunt-ley Bar with her two children, ages 2 and 5, and friend Chan-5, and friend Chan-dra Sinnot and her infant child. At 3 p.m Tomigan was trying disc from the river at Huntley Park, about six miles east of Gold Beach, when she en-tered deep water and lost her footing, ac-cording to eyewitness reports.
Sinnot tried to save
Jarnigan, who was not

wearing any flotation devices, but they were both swept down river. A man camping at Huntley Park heard the commotion and jumped in the water to help the pair, authorithe pair, authori-said. See River, Page 5A

City cuts loss, offers new lease for course

losses with The Claveran
Group and going with
a newly-formed firm to
operate Salmon Run golf
course.

Monday at its regular meeting, the council agreed to terminate the lease with the golf course management firm after 14 years of failing to turn a profit at the city-owned golf course, and instead sign on with Wild Rivers Golf Management, owned by current golf course manage Ed Murdoch and former county commissioner Genze. commissioner George Rhodes of Brookings

The popular golf course is located 3.5 miles up the south bank of the Cheto River, on 182 acres in the Jack Creek
Steve Muir, principal of The Claveran Group, notified the city that it would like to end the lease agreement it has

would like to end the lease agreement it has held since 1998. The city and management firm are in the 14th year of a 60-year lease. In those years, his firm has only made a partial payment on its lease, and come under fire for sub-par management of the course, including maintaining the edges of the bramble streven hillsides and conducting publicity to attract new publicity to attract new See Golf, Page 5A
